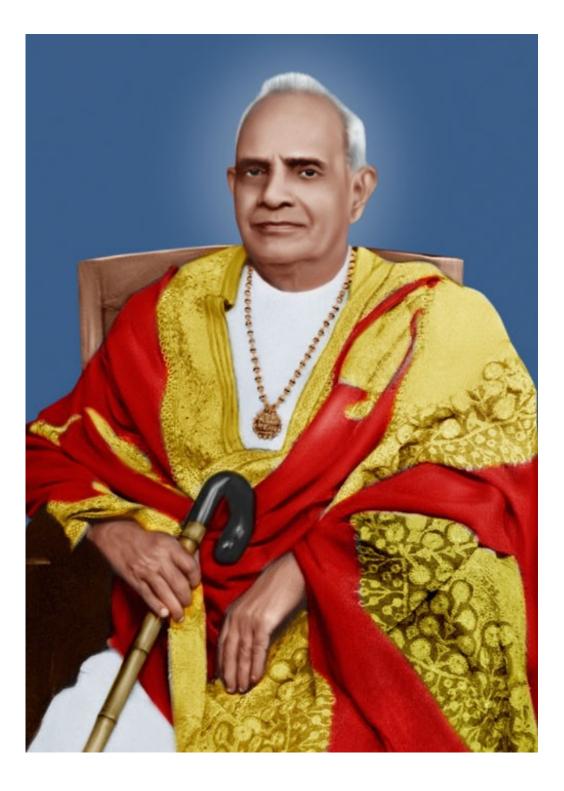

ABOUT THE FOUNDER

Sri. Mannathu Padmanabhan, the peerless leader of Nair Community, the immortal founder of the Nair Service Society and the great social reformer was born in the closing decades of the 19th century in Perunnai, a village in Changanacherry taluk of the erstwhile state of Travancore as the son of middle-class parents. Abject poverty, misery and deprivation marked the early years of his life. After school education he became a teacher and then a pleader. Before long he found himself drawn into the vortex of political and social movements. The plight of the Nair Community that was witnessing its own decadence and disintegration, precipitated by extravaganza, superstitious veneration for antiquated and anachronistic customs and tradition, filled him with anguish. He marshalled his skill and organizational ability to motivate, inspire and mobilize the community that was lost in a long and deep slumber. The Nair Service Society which he conceived, nursed and nurtured epitomized the hopes and aspirations of the community which had been waiting for a saviour.

Mannam's personal life was inextricably intertwined with the history of the N.S.S. He travelled extensively through the state, met the people, organized them and won their love and regard with the help of his disarming simplicity, single-minded devotion, will and determination. Impregnable fortress of superstition and formidable citadel of resistance crumbled before his all-conquering and awe-inspiring personality. Gradually he built an empire out of nothing. The prestigious institutions founded by him would perpetuate his memory. Captivated by Mahatma Gandhi and his principles of Satyagraha, Mannam led a Satyagraha march called "Savarnajatha" for the sake of the untouchables. It ultimately led to the "Temple Entry Proclamation". The dynamic roles he played in the "Vaikom Satyagraham" and in the independence struggle and his subsequent imprisonment and his initiatives aimed at communal harmony, peace and social changes turned him into a legend in his life time. The major milestones in the history of the N.S.S intersect the social, political and cultural history of Kerala. Mannam passed away at the ripe age of 93. The story of his life is the stuff, fairy tales are made of. The touch of his magic wand revived and resurrected the entire community. He taught them the philosophy of action, the value of unity and above all the need to change. His legacy is undiminished by passage of time. He lives through generations.

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NSS COLLEGE OTTAPALAM: A PROFILE

N.S.S. College, Ottapalam (Accredited with 'A' status by NAAC), affiliated to the University of Calicut, is one of the Arts and Science Colleges under the management of Nair Service Society founded by Bharatha Kesari Sri. Mannath Padmanabhan. It was consecrated by Swami Vishadanandha, President of Sree Ramakrishna Ashram, Palappuram and was formally inaugurated by Mrs. Prabhakaran Thampan on 10th July 1961. In July 1962 it was upgraded and was shifted to the present site. The premises of the college consist mostly of donations from Ms. K.P.S. Menon and Sri. Vapala Sankaranarayanan Menon. Ever since its inception in July 1961, the history of the college is marked by excellence in academic activities, service to the community and accountability. It has its motto, "*Lucerna Pedibus Meis*" meaning, "Thy word is a lamp unto my feet". With its vision, "Lead me from Darkness to Light", the college offers thirteen U.G. and six Post graduate Programmes. It has been accredited in 2007 and reaccredited with grade 'A' in 2017. The college celebrated its golden Jubilee in 2011.

Situated on the sprawling 20 acres on the left side of Palakkad - Ponnani Road, four kilometers East of Ottapalam town, the college is noted for its greenery. The tall trees inside the college quadrangle provide ample shade and cool ambience for teaching and learning activities. The college caters to the needs of the students of Malappuram, Palakkad and Thrissur districts. Seventy percent of the students are girls and the college is free from gender discrimination. The college Women's hostel is a home away from home. All administrative and academic activities of the college are planned by the Planning Board and monitored and evaluated by Internal Quality Assurance Cell. The PTA helps to maintain a rapport between all stakeholders. Alumni association is a source of strength for the college. Grievance Redressal Cell, Women's Cell, Anti-ragging Cell, Career Guidance and Placement Cell and Entrepreneurial Development Club are some of the Clubs/ Cells functioning in the college. NSS units of the college work to create social awareness among the students. ASAP, a student support programme which concentrates on soft skills training and IT, run with Government funding, is another attraction of the college. New Initiatives of Higher Education Department, WWS and SSP motivate the students to emerge in life. An automated well-stacked library with browsing facilty is the greatest attraction of the college. The college also runs innovative programmes like finishing School for the outgoing students. The brilliant students of the college with high IQ attract Multinationals like TCS, Wipro for campus placements. Physical Education Department grooms sports teams and prepares them for University/State and National level competitions. In short, the college can boast of all facilities to serve the student community.

CHOICE BASED CREDIT AND SEMESTER SYSTEM

Calicut University regulations are framed in accordance with UGC guidelines on restructuring undergraduate education from 2019 academic year. Accordingly, all affiliated colleges have restructured the regular undergraduate programmes on the Choice Based Credit Semester System (CBCSS), a combination of internal and external evaluation with grading.

Semester & Duration

Semester means a term consisting of 18 weeks (16 instructional weeks and two weeks for examination). The duration of a UG programme shall be 6 semesters distributed over a period of 3 academic years.

Courses

The UG programme shall include five types of courses, *viz.*, Common Courses, Core courses, Complementary courses, Open Course and Audit courses.

Credit &Grade

Credit of a course measure is measure of weekly unit of work involving lecture or laboratory sessions or seminar or similar activity designed for the course. Each credit hour is roughly equivalent to one hour of class per week in a semester. 'Grade' indicates the level of performance of a student in a course.

Grade Point

It is an integer indicating the numerical equivalent of the broad level of performance of a student in a course. The product of Grade Point and the Credit of a course is called 'Credit Point'. Grade Point means point given to a letter grade on 10 point scale.

Semester Grade Point Average (SGPA)

It is the value obtained by dividing the sum of credit points obtained by a student in the various courses taken in a semester by the total number of credits in that semester. SGPA shall be rounded off to three decimal places.

Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA)

It is the value obtained by dividing the sum of credit points in all the semesters taken by the student for the entire programme by the total number of credits in the entire programme and shall be rounded off to three decimal places.

Extra credit Activities:

Extra credits are mandatory for the programme. Extra credits will be awarded to students who participate in activities like NCC, NSS and Swachh Bharat. Those students who could not join in any of the above activities have to undergo Calicut University Social Service Programme (CUSSP). Extra credits are not counted for SGPA or CGPA.

Grace Marks

Grace marks may be awarded to a student for meritorious achievements in co-curricular activities (in Sports/Arts/NSS/NCC/Student Entrepreneurship) carried out besides the regular hours. Such a benefit is applicable and limited to a maximum of 8 courses in an academic year spreading over two semesters. In addition, maximum of 6 marks per semester can be awarded to the students of UG Programmes, for participating in the College Fitness Education Programme (COFE).

In CUSSP, a student has to complete 12 days of social service. This has to be completed in the first four semesters; 3 days in each semester.

ADMISSION

UNDERGRADUATE PROGRAMMES

Any candidate who wishes to join First UG Degree Programme under Calicut University should compulsorily register online *https://ugcap.uoc.ac.in* (website). A candidate will have the facility to apply for various Programmes and colleges through a single registration. (*For more details visit University website*)

Admission and Withdrawal

- 1. Students are usually admitted only in the beginning of the 1st term of the year to the degree and post graduate courses.
- 2. There shall be provision for Inter Collegiate and Inter University Transfer in third and fifth semester within a period of two weeks from the date of commencement of the semester. College transfer may be permitted in Second and Fourth semester also without change in complementary course within a period of two weeks from the date of commencement of the semester concerned.
- 3. Applicant for admission to the 1st year UG degree class must have passed the +2 of Govt. of Kerala or 12th class of CBSE or an examination recognized equivalent there to.
- 4. Candidates seeking admission must produce transfer and conduct certificates from the school or college they last attended and qualifying certificates and mark list in original at the time of admission.
- 5. Candidates seeking admission to the college from other universities should apply for recognition from the University of Calicut.
- 6. Candidates will have to pay the required tuition fees due at the time of admission, caution deposit and all other fees prescribed by the college. Students belonging to SC, ST, Other Eligible Communities and converted from the above communities and others whose parent's income is less than the prescribed limit will be exempted from fees as per norms and need not pay any tuition fees.
- 7. Students belonging to other backward classes and converts from other region should produce the community and income certificate from the regional Thansildar at the time of admission, failing which they will not be exempted from the payment of fees.
- 8. Any candidate found to have obtained admission by false representation shall be summarily dismissed and shall forfeit whatever fees he/she may have paid.
- 9. A student applying for TC will not be given the certificate unless he/ she pays all fees and other dues as the Principal may deem fit. Usually TC will be issued only on the completion of the course.
- 10. A late fee of Rs. 55 will be charged if a student applies for T.C one year after the beginning of the academic year immediately following that during which he/she has been last enrolled.
- 11. A fee of Rs 105/- will be charged for the issue of a duplicate transfer certificate. A duplicate certificate will be issued only on the production of an affidavit signed by a judicial First Class Magistrate.
- 12. Students who have left the college with T.C are not eligible to get a new one for a second time. However duplicate certificate will be issued on production of an affidavit signed by a Judicial First Class Magistrate in a stamp paper of value Rs.200/-.
- 13. A student applying for the release of any document from the college must have cleared all dues to the college.
- 14. A fees of Rs.100/- will be charged for a document that needs reference to the record older than five years.

CODE OF CONDUCT

1. General Standards of Discipline

- a. The students of the college are expected to conduct themselves in accordance with the best standards in manners and behaviour.
- b. Students should not disturb ongoing lectures if they arrive late for their lecture or while walking in the corridors when lectures are on, or while they await the lecturer in the classroom.
- c. Maintenance of classroom cleanliness is the responsibility of students who occupy those spaces.
- d. No student is allowed to leave the lecture hall without the Lecturer's permission or until the class is dismissed.
- e. Students are not allowed to loiter on the verandas or corridors of the college talking or laughing around during class hours. Students who have no class during any particular hour shall remain in the classroom/ reading room.
- f. Switching off the classroom lights and fans when not in use is a good green practice that all classroom users should follow.
- g. In the College Laboratories, students are expected to closely follow the instructions of the Staff-in-Charge.
- h. The College Gym is available to all students as per the direction and during the time announced by the Faculty of Physical Education. Those using the gym facilities are urged to use them properly. Eatables are prohibited in the gym. Students are encouraged to participate in the various sports tournaments that college organizes.
- i. Students shall handle all college properties with care. They are not allowed to disfigure the building, compound walls, desks or benches with any writings or engraving or posters.
- j. College/ Department fests/ programmes have to be organized only with prior permission from the Principal and executed under the supervision of either the Staff Committee appointed by the Principal or a faculty from the concerned department. The Principal must be kept informed about the content of these activities.
- k. No notice or appeal of any kind shall be circulated among the students or pasted on the notice board or anywhere within the college premises. Students are not allowed to organize or conduct meeting in college or collect money for any purpose without the prior permission of the Principal.
- 1. Students are liable to disciplinary action (even dismissal) if found smoking in the campus, or are in possession of/under the influence of tobacco products, forbidden drugs or alcoholic beverages.
- m. Ragging is forbidden by the laws of the country. Any student involved in ragging / persuades other for ragging or advocates ragging / either inside or outside an educational institution shall be subject to a punishment of not more than 2 years imprisonment, in addition to a penalty not over Rs.10,000/-.
- n. Students are prohibited from making mass representations in a body but they may make representation individually to Principal.
- o. Students are not allowed to take part in any political agitation directed against the authority of Government or Management or in any movement or agitation of any kind which may result in ill-feeling between different sections of the community or which tends to excite feeling of disloyalty or disaffection.
- p. Boys and girls are expected to conduct themselves with dignity and maturity. In their inter-relationships, they must observe norms of decency and propriety.
- q. At the time of admission, every student signs a declaration, on his / her Admission Form, that he /she will abide by all the Rules and Regulations of the College and will accept the decision of the Principal, in all matters, as final. He / She will also give an undertaking to accept the College Rules.
- r. Practice sessions for all programs should be held either prior to or after classes.

- s. Irregular attendance, insubordination to teachers, habitual negligence to class, obscenity in word or deed or any act of misconduct or indiscipline are sufficient reason to be recorded in the punishment Register or for suspension or expulsion of student from the college.
- t. A student whose name has gone into the punishment Register of the college may not receive a certificate of good conduct and character from the principal.
- u. Students should take note of the announcement and other notifications put on the Notice Board and failure to do so will not be an excuse for acts of commission or omission.
- v. Using mobile hand set camera within the campus is strictly forbidden. (Kerala Govt. Order No. 23856/K3/2009)
- w. Outsiders are not permitted to attend college functions. Strict action will be taken on those who bring outsiders into the campus.

2. Student Identification

- a. Every student is required to wear his/her College issued identity card at all times on the college campus.
- b. The card should be shown to the staff or college officials when asked, especially during an examination, formal program, in the administrative office and library.

3. Ethics and Conduct

- Students are expected to wear clothes that contribute to the academic atmosphere necessary on a campus.
- Malpractices during Examinations
- If a student is detected using unfair means or is found in possession of a mobile/ electronic gadget or is found within reach of material pertaining to the test/ exam, then he/ she will have to face the Examination Squad constituted by the College. If the Committee finds the individual guilty, he/ she will be given zero marks for that specific course or for all the exams of the concerned semester. Even those found abetting such behaviour will be given a similar penalty,
- The use of mobile phones and other electronic gadgets for any purpose during lectures and practicals is not allowed, unless the lecturer has permitted the use of such gadgets for the lecture / discussion.
- Students cannot wear smartwatches during any examination. If a student is found with any electronic gadget during an examination, he / she will be immediately reported.

WORKING DAYS & CLASS HOURS

ATTENDANCE & LEAVE OF ABSENCE

• An academic year will constitute of two semesters and the tenure is as follows:

Odd Semester: June to October &

Even Semester: November to March

The teaching day is divided into two sessions, the forenoon session of three hours and the afternoon session of two hours. Attendance will be marked at the beginning of each hour by the teacher engaging the class. Late comers will not be entertained. For the purpose of attendance, all teaching days irrespective of working periods shall be considered as full working days. Absenting an hour in any session will be treated as half days absence. Leave for one hour can be obtained from the teacher in charge of the class.

- Students are expected to attend classes every day. However, if there are genuine reasons like ill-health, students can avail leave (in the prescribed format given in the College Calendar) after obtaining permission from the mentors and Head of the Department.
- Application for long leave should be made to the Principal through the class tutor and HOD. Application for sick leave for more than three days should be supported by reliable medical certificate.
- A student who is continuously absent for 14 days without sufficient reason and proper intimation to the Principal of the college shall be removed from the roll.
- For being permitted to appear for University Semester Examinations shall be subjected to the following conditions.

(a) The student should have earned at least 75% of the attendance prescribed by the college for the programme in each semester.

(b) Those students who represent the college in Sports, NSS and other extra and co-curricular activities should obtain prior permission from the Mentor before taking leave to claim other duty attendance. The student should submit a letter of request for permission to the Mentor, forwarded by the Coordinators in-charge of the respective activities. On completion of such activities, within two working days, the student must submit the application for extracurricular and other leaves (as prescribed in the college calendar) for the extra-curricular or co-curricular attendance.

(d) Participation in such activities may be treated as presence in lieu of their absence on production of participation/ attendance certificate (within 2 weeks) in curricular/ extracurricular activities (maximum 9 days in a semester). Students can avail of condonation of shortage of attendance in a maximum of four semesters during the entire programme (Either four single condonations or one double condonation and two single condonations during the entire programme). If a student fails to get the required attendance within condonable limit, he/she can move to the next semester only if he/she aquires 50% attendance. In that case, a provisional registration is needed. Such students can appear for supplementary examination for such semesters after the completion of the programme. Less than 50% attendance requires Readmission. Readmission is permitted only once during the entire programme.

- No concession of attendance will be allowed to College Union Office Bearers for organizing College Union Activities. But attendance to those office bearers will be allowed as per University Guidelines and for those days for which the leave application is submitted as per the format given in the College Calendar.
- The attendance for the students of the first semester is calculated from the date of joining the college. However, for those students who join the college after a break in studies, the attendance will be counted from the beginning of the semester.
- Student seeking exemption from rules relating to minimum attendance should apply for exemption to the University through the Principal before 28th February. Every application for exemption shall be made in the prescribed format accompanied by a chalan for required fee. The reason for each day's absence has to be explained.
- In case of absence on account of illness, medical certificate should also be furnished. No application for exemption will be recommended by the Principal unless he is satisfied that the shortage of attendance was

beyond the student's control. In no case will exemption be granted by the University if the shortage of attendance exceeds 20 days. Exemption will not be granted to the same student for more than one academic year in a course. Absence without leave will not be considered under any circumstances.

• Complaints with regard to attendance, if any, must be brought to the notice of the Attendance Committee.

• Examination and Annual Progress Certificate (APC)

- a. External Examination will be held at the end of each semester for all classes. No student is permitted to absent himself/herself from the examination without the permission of the Principal.
- b. Class tests will be held from time to time for internal evaluation.
- c. Progress report will be sent to the student's guardian after each examination. The progress report is to be returned to the Principal within a week with the signature of the guardian. Guardians of those students who show poor progress should meet the concerned group tutor on receipt of the report.
- d. The annual progress certificate of students will be sent to the University strictly on the basis of the attendance and progress of each student as reported by the teacher in- charge. APC shall be issued only to those who are having sufficient attendance and progress in his studies.

EXAMINATIONS

- There shall be University examinations at the end of each semester.
- Examination and Annual Progress Certificate (APC)
 - e. External Examination will be held at the end of each semester for all classes. No student is permitted to absent himself/herself from the examination without the permission of the Principal.
 - f. Class tests will be held from time to time for internal evaluation.
 - g. Progress report will be sent to the student's guardian after each examination. The progress report is to be returned to the Principal within a week with the signature of the guardian. Guardians of those students who show poor progress should meet the concerned group tutor on receipt of the report.
 - h. The annual progress certificate of students will be sent to the University strictly on the basis of the attendance and progress of each student as reported by the teacher in- charge. APC shall be issued only to those who are having sufficient attendance and progress in his studies.
- Audit course: The students can attain only pass (Grade P) for these courses. At the end of each semester there shall be examination conducted by the college. The students can also attain the credits through online courses like SWAYAM, MOOC etc.
- Improvement Course: Improvement of a particular semester can be done only once. The student shall avail of the improvement chance in the succeeding year after the successful completion of the semester concerned. If the candidate fails to appear for the improvement examination after registration, or if there is no change in the results of the improved examination, the mark/grade obtained in the first appearance will be retained. Improvement and supplementary examinations cannot be done simultaneously.

EVALUATION SCHEME FOR UNDERGRADUATE COURSES

- The evaluation scheme for each course shall contain two parts for

 Internal assessment; 2) External Evaluation
 weight shall be given to the internal assessment. The remaining 80% weight shall be for
 the external evaluation
- Internal Assessment:
 - Theory Courses: Components with percentage of marks of Internal Evaluation of Theory Courses are-Test paper 40%, Assignment 20%, Seminar 20% and Class room participation based on attendance 20%.
 - Practical Courses: For practical courses Record 60% and lab involvement 40% as far as internal is concerned.
 - Project: Internal assessment of the project will be based on its content, method of presentation, final conclusion and orientation to research aptitude.
- External Evaluation: The external question papers may be of uniform pattern with 80/60 marks. The courses with 60 marks will have an external examination of 2 hours duration with and courses with 80 marks will have an external examination of 2.5 hours duration.
- Revaluation: Students can apply for photocopies of answer scripts of external examinations. Applications for photocopies/scrutiny/revaluation should be submitted within 10 days of publication of results. The fee for this shall be as decided by the University.

PARENT TEACHER ASSOCIATION

The Parent Teacher Association is a statutorily constituted elected body which aims at the overall development of the College. Parental co-operation in creating a healthy campus atmosphere is of utmost importance. The PTA aspires for co- operation and participation of parents in full measure, in the wholesome activities of the College.

An Executive Committee, comprising the Principal as Chairman, a Teacher elected as the Secretary and Seven others, meets frequently to carry out the regular affairs of the body. A general body, consisting of all the parents and teachers, meets occasionally, and it gives paramount importance to ensuring a healthy and friendly academic atmosphere in the College.

The PTA has been focusing on the growth and development of the College since its inception. The body collects only a moderate amount as donation from the parents which are utilized in the College for the welfare of the students. It provides salary for the Guest Lectures, Security Staff. The cleanliness of the college is also looked after by the PTA. It also supports the poor and backward students.

COLLEGE FACILITIES

I. LIBRARY & READING ROOM

The primary aim of the library is to establish a learning environment for the academic community. It is an integral part of the college and plays a pivotal role in dissemination of knowledge through books, journals, magazines and other digital media.

- The library has a circulation area, reference area and an area for display of periodicals.
- Additional reading area is also attached with the library.
- The library has subscribed the N-LIST library consortium (database of E-books & E-Journals) and offers access to its contents through password protected user accounts.
- A web-centric, open source library management software, KOHA, is used for automating library housekeeping operations.

Library Regulations

- Registration should be done to become a member and to use library resources.
- Strict silence and discipline must be observed inside the library.
- College identity card is compulsory for all users. This card is strictly non- transferable.
- The users must record their visit to library.
- Users are supposed to deposit their personal belongings at the property counter prior to their entry into the library.
- Library follows open access system and users should try to replace books in their original position in the shelf after consulting. If in doubt, they may keep the book on their reading table.
- Newspapers, Magazines and Journals must be read only in the library on specific tables and should not be taken outside.
- Users should not disturb the arrangements of books.
- Users should take care of cleanliness of the library.

Reference Library

- The books in the Reference Section are not lent out to students. The students are permitted to make use of them in the reading room.
- The book in the Reference Section may be lent out o a faculty member with the permission of the Professor-in- charge of the library.

General Library

- The General Library will be open from 9.30 am to 4.30 pm on all working days.
- The books pertaining to different subjects and books for general reading is issued to students, faculty and staff from the issue counter of the college Library.
- Issue and return of books are completely computerized. In addition to issue and return, calculation of fine, reservation of documents, information retrieval of books can also be done with the help of this software.
- Each student has to show the library card before borrowing a book.
- Book issued to the students shall not be retained for more than 14 days from the date of issue. If the due date falls on a holiday, the book must be returned on the next working day.
- Any book can be recalled at any time even if the period of loan has not expired.
- Failure of return of books on the due date entails a fine of Rs.1/- per day of delay for each book.
- Failure to pay library fine or failure to return of books within the due date by a student entails loss of privilege to borrow any more books from the library till the overdue books are returned.

- Marking on book in ink or pencil, spoiling or damaging binding, underlining of passage, writing or remarks etc. on the leaves of the books or on illustrations, tearing off pages, pictures etc., are punishable by heavy fines.
- If any book is lost, damaged or mutilated the borrowers shall be required to replace the book or pay such compensation as may be fixed by the Principal.
- If books belonging to a set or series are lost or damaged and a new volume is not separately available the damaged shall be required to replace the whole set or series.
- Before leaving the counter borrowers shall examine the books taken by them and point out any mutilations or damages in any book to the librarian and have these defects noted in the book and initialled by him. Otherwise the borrowers will be held responsible for any damage or mutilation observed.
- It shall be the duty of the librarian and his staff to examine the books returned by the borrowers and take immediate action in all cases of mutilation or damage.
- The transfer or sub lending of books is strictly prohibited.

Reading Room

- The papers and periodicals lying on the table shall not be removed from the reading room or from the place allotted for each.
- Reading aloud and talking in the reading room are strictly forbidden.
- Any loss or damage will have to be paid for by the person responsible for it.
- Umbrellas, handbags and other personal belongings including books must be left outside before entering the reading room.
- Students should leave the reading room five minutes before the closing time.

II. LABORATORY

• Science laboratories: Botany, Chemistry, Electronics and Zoology UG laboratory and

Computer Science and Physics UG and PG laboratories for bonafide regular students

• Code of conduct: All breakages in the laboratory should be paid for. Hall tickets will not be issued unless all dues are paid and cleared.

III. WIFI CAMPUS

The campus is Wi-Fi enabled and is available in all academic blocks for use of faculty and students.

IV. SPORTS FACILITIES

- The college has well equipped basketball, badminton courts, a football field and gymnasium.
- Students are encouraged to participate in inter-class and inter-collegiate tournaments.
- Students should enroll themselves with the Physical Education Faculty for regular practice, which is the requirement for selection into the sports and games team.
- Students of the College will be required to play games regularly and receive regular Physical training
- Outstanding sports persons get special consideration for admission to Ist year classes.
- The winners in various sports and games are eligible for Grace marks in the University examinations as in the order following:
 - (a) In Inter University Championships Winner–18% Runner–15%
 - Third--12% Fourth -10%
 - (b) Representing University -7%
 - (c) In Intercollegiate championship and sports
 Ist Position 6% 2nd Position 4%
 3rd Position 2%

V. SEMINAR HALLS & AUDITORIUM

- The Seminar Hall in the main campus building houses 250 people, besides, the seminar halls in the History block and RUSA building that can accommodate more than 250 people. The seminar halls are used for conferences, seminars and meetings of different audience sizes.
- The seminar hall may be used for academic, extra-curricular, society activities, seminars, and short-term administrative activities with the permission from the concerned authorities.

VI. CANTEEN

• The college canteen offers delicious food and meals at affordable rates. Canteen Committee monitors the conduct of canteen through regular check of quality and the menu of the food served.

VII. GIRLS HOSTEL

Hostel is provided only for girl students. A student if permitted to reside in hostel shall pay at the time of admission the following.

- 1. Application fee of Rs.20/- (Non refundable)
- 2. Admission fee of Rs 50/- (Non refundable)
- 3. Caution deposit of Rs. 2,000/- (Refundable at the end of the academic year)
- 4. Development Fund Rs. 500/-

Lodging Regulations

- Inmates shall occupy the room allotted to them by the Deputy Warden and no change shall be made without Warden's permission.
- Inmates should be in their rooms during study time and during night.
- Lights in the rooms should be switched off between 11 pm and 5 am.
- Hostel belongings should not be tampered with.
- Inmates are permitted to receive local visitors only between 4 pm and 5 pm.

- Parents of students and guests are allowed to stay in the hostel only with prior permission of the Deputy Warden.
- Absence from the hostel should be only with the prior permission of the Deputy Warden.
- Complaints or grievances of any kind can be submitted in writing to the Deputy Warden. Mass representations are not allowed.
- Inmates violating any of the rules are liable to be fined, suspended or expelled from the hostel and expulsion from the hostel leads to the expulsion from the college as well.
- The Hostel Warden is empowered to frame new rules and regulations from time to time for the smooth and peaceful running of the hostel.
